Graham declared deceased after 2015 disappearance

LUMBERTON — A judge in Robeson County Superior Court ruled Monday to legally declare Sara Nicole Graham deceased, more than 11 years after her disappearance.

The ruling is pursuant to N.C. General Statute, which says a missing person can be presumed dead if they have been absent from their last known residence or unheard from for a continuous period of seven years.

Graham, who was 18 at the time of her disappearance,

has been missing since Feb. 4, 2015. She left her Fairmont-area home for work at around 6:30 a.m. that morning but never arrived, authorities say, and her van was discovered around 12:15 p.m. the same day, abandoned in an area on East McDonald Road, north of Fairmont.

“On the 10th anniversary of Sara’s disappearance, my office and the FBI held a news conference telling the community there had not been confirmed contact or a sighting of Sara and to this day, our investigation has found no evidence

Sara drove her van to the field along East McDonald Road where it was found on Feb. 4, 2015,” said Robeson County Sheriff Burnis Wilkins. “Let me be clear, the judge’s ruling does not alter our search for Sara, it does expand the scope of our joint case from a missing person to a homicide. We continue to use every available investigative method, technology, and resource to search for Sara.”

At the time of her disappearance, Graham was described as being 5-foot-4 and weighing

UNCP’s Hansberry turns personal wake-up call into mission to improve mental health literacy

PEMBROKE — For Donavin Hansberry, a senior mass communication major at University of North Carolina Pembroke, a life-changing moment in 2024 reshaped his path.

After spending time with a close friend one evening, Hansberry didn’t hear from him the next day. When he later learned the friend had experienced a serious mental health crisis and had been hospitalized, the experience left a lasting impression.

“It bothered me deeply,” Hansberry said. “I didn’t think about mental health until it was right in front of me.”

Determined to help others recognize warning signs and start conversations earlier, Hansberry and longtime friend Jayden Haggler founded Shift Toward Hope, a nonprofit dedicated to improving mental health literacy, particularly among young people.

The organization, established as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, focuses on providing educational resources, creative storytelling and community engagement to address “mental health deserts” — communities with limited access to resources and awareness.

“Mental health starts with a conversation,” Hansberry said.

Hansberry, originally from Northern Virginia, transferred to UNCP, where he played football before a back injury ended his playing career. Now scheduled to graduate in December with a concentration in public relations, he has redirected his competitive drive into entrepreneurship and advocacy.

In 2024, Hansberry was selected among the top 60 student entrepreneurs nationwide to represent UNCP in the Red Bull Basement competition. But the experience with his friend changed his priorities.

“We stepped back from that project and said, ‘We have to help,’” he said.

The pair immersed themselves in

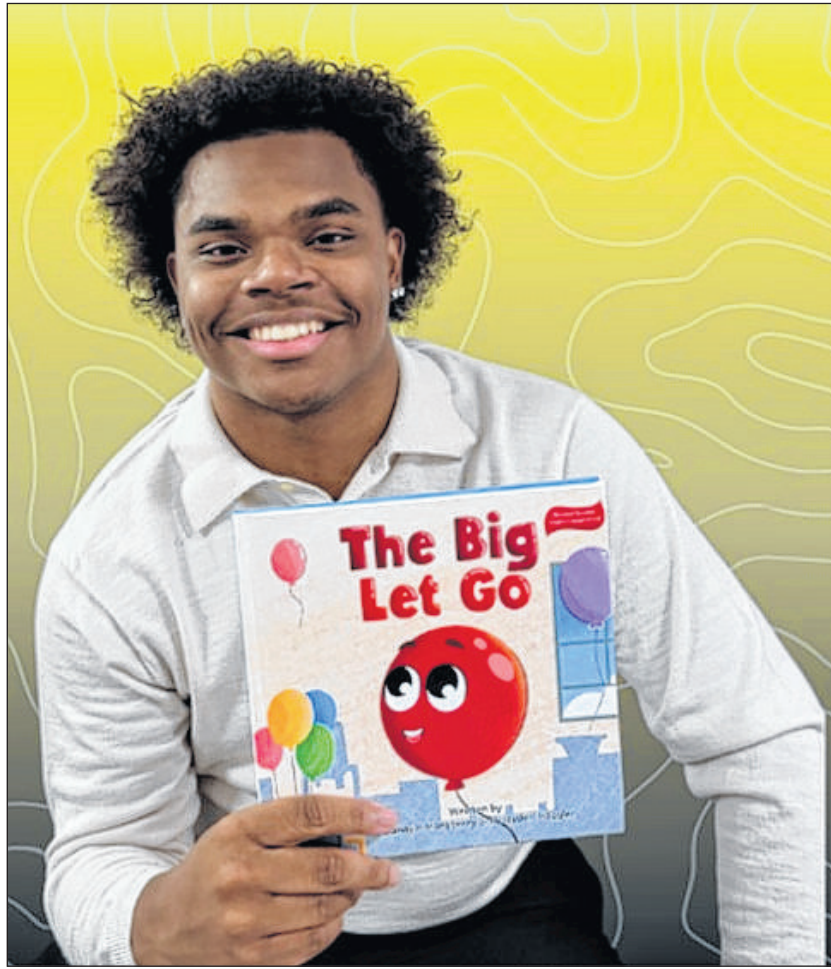

mental health research and began assembling a nonprofit structure, including a board of mental health professionals to review and guide all the organization’s content.

One of the organization’s first major projects was a children’s book titled “The Big Let Go,” designed to help young readers understand fear and anxiety.

The story follows Benny the Balloon, a character who is afraid to let go and float into the sky. Through the narrative, children learn that fear is a natural emotion — but when it becomes overwhelming and prevents action, it can turn into anxiety.

The book includes discussion prompts and tools for parents, teachers and caregivers to help guide conversations about mental health.

“Our goal was to create something that families could talk about together,” Hansberry said.

More than a 1,000 copies have been sold, with the book now available through major retailers including Barnes & Noble, Walmart and Amazon. Copies are also being used in classrooms from preschool through middle school. Proceeds support the nonprofit’s initiatives, including donating books to schools and supporting educational programming.

Shift Toward Hope has quickly grown beyond a single project. The nonprofit operates through three primary initiatives: media production, community development and college chapters and has active chapters at the University

Trio charged with multiple drug offenses

ROBESON COUNTY — Two separate investigations have resulted in the seizure of narcotics and multiple guns, the Robeson County Sheriff's Office said Thursday.

On Wednesday, the RCSO Drug Enforcement Division conducted a search at a residence located on Cornith Road, just north of Pembroke. During the investigation, a quantity of cocaine, U.S. currency, and firearms were located and seized.

As a result of the investigation, Jimmy Dean Jacobs, 35, and Phyllis A. Locklear, 48,

both of Pembroke, were arrested and charged with two counts trafficking in cocaine, conspiracy to traffic cocaine, possession with intent to sell and deliver cocaine, maintaining a dwelling for a controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Jacobs was also charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

Jacobs is currently being held at the Robeson County Detention Center

Locklear is currently being held at the Robeson County Detention Center under a \$500,000 secured bond.

Also on Wednesday, the RCSO Community Impact Team conducted a traffic stop in the area of Lowe Road and Hwy 74 West, west of Lumberton.

During the traffic stop a quantity of cocaine, Xanax, marijuana, and firearms were located and seized.

Luke Gibson, 27, of Lumberton was arrested and charged with felony possession of a schedule-VI controlled substance, possession with intent to manufacture, sell, and deliver a schedule-VI controlled substance, felony possession of cocaine, maintaining a vehicle for a controlled substance, felony possession of a schedule-IV controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Gibson is currently being held at the Robeson County Detention Center

Anyone with additional information or any information regarding drug activity in Robeson County is asked to call the Robeson County Sheriff's Office Drug Enforcement Division at 910-671-3191 or email drugs@robesoncountytsonc.gov.

"Under our system of justice, every person is presumed to be innocent unless proven guilty in a court of law," a social media post by RCSO states. "The information contained in this

post is not intended to be an expression of opinion regarding guilt. The views and opinions expressed by private citizens who may comment on this post are not adopted by and do not reflect the official policy or position of this law enforcement agency."

"The Sheriff's Office does not issue or determine bond amounts," the post also says. "This is done through a judicial official, such as a judge or magistrate, as per N.C. General Statute 15A-532. Many factors are considered when determining bond amounts."

NCDMV launches new in-office document upload tool

ROCKY MOUNT — North Carolina drivers no longer have to leave a driver license office or make a return

trip when they forget a printed copy of their proof of insurance or residency documents. The N.C. Division of Motor Vehicles (NCDMV) has introduced a new in-office

document upload tool that allows customers to securely share important documents directly from their phones.

The tool was initially launched to address the most commonly forgotten document – proof of insurance. However, NCDMV staff quickly recognized additional opportunities and expanded it. Customers can now securely upload documents such as insurance cards or policies, phone bills, bank statements, leases, utility bills, and other proof of residency

documents while at the counter.

"Within the first two weeks, customers have already uploaded more than 6,000 documents using the new tool," said NCDMV Commissioner Paul Tine. "This early success shows that North Carolinians are ready for a more convenient, modern DMV experience. We're especially proud that our frontline teams saw the potential and moved quickly to expand the tool, helping even more customers stay in line and complete their

transactions without delay."

Many customers already store important documents on their phones. Instead of being turned away or needing to find a printer, they can now upload eligible documents on the spot.

Customers should continue to bring original identity documents — such as passports, Social Security cards, and birth certificates — as federal law requires DMV staff to examine these in person.

Paper copies of proof of insurance and resi-

dency documents are still accepted, but the upload tool provides a convenient alternative.

"This new feature is one more step in our work to reduce wait times, prevent repeat visits, and deliver better service to the people of North Carolina," added Tine.

The document tool is now available at all driver license offices statewide.

RichmondCC adding 6 new teaching licensure pathways

HAMLET — Richmond Community College has been given the green light by the State Board of the North Carolina Community College System to add six more Residency Licensure Certificates to its college curriculum. This was announced at RichmondCC's Board of Trustees meeting on Tuesday.

RichmondCC currently offers an Elementary Education Residency Licensure Certificate that is designed for individuals with bachelor's degrees who are currently or intending to teach in elementary schools. It provides a local and convenient pathway for elementary classroom teachers to receive their North Carolina teacher's license.

"Formerly known as lateral entry, these are people who are already teaching, but they need to become licensed," said Elementary Education Licensure Program Coordinator Krystal Harris. "This certificate program allows them to take the required courses while they are teaching and then be able to sit for the state licensure exam."

RichmondCC began offering this program in 2024. Because of its success, the State Board is allowing RichmondCC to offer six more licensure programs:

- Birth through Kindergarten Residency Licensure Certificate

- High School Math Residency Licensure Certificate
- High School Science Residency Licensure Certificate
- Middle School Math Residency Licensure Certificate
- Middle School Science Residency Licensure Certificate

- Special Education Residency Licensure Certificate

RichmondCC will begin offering three of those this coming fall semester: Birth through Kindergarten, High School Math and Special Education.

"We thought we were just going to get approved for the middle school programs, but they basically opened it up for us, which means we are doing a good job, and they are happy with our performance with this type of curriculum," RichmondCC President Brent Barbee said.

Because the State Board approved these curriculum additions, RichmondCC's Board of Trustees did not have to vote to approve.

Also at the Board of Trustees meeting, Barbee provided an update on several construction projects, including the repaving of a large section of the parking lot on the Hamlet Campus. The Board approved and accepted the bid from Barnhill Contracting Company. That project will take approximately three weeks, and the College plans to have those renovations completed during July.

The Board also approved the bid from Piedmont Commercial Roofing for replacing the roof of the Cole Auditorium.

Due to a minor change order in the Hendrick Center for Automotive Training Center, completion of that project will be delayed a few weeks, pushing the final date to Aug. 9. However, RichmondCC leadership is planning an initial walk-through of the new facility on Monday.

FROM THE LEGISLATURE

Budd, Tillis lead bill to boost U.S. markets

WASHINGTON — U.S. Sens. Ted Budd (R-N.C.) and Reverend Raphael Warnock (D-Ga.) led several of their colleagues in introducing the Encouraging Public Offerings Act on Thursday to limit regulatory risk that holds companies back from engaging with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) in the Initial Public Offering (IPO) process. The bipartisan legislation would codify existing SEC rules and make the initial IPO registration process more confidential and less burdensome, thereby reducing the regulatory risk of going public and encouraging companies to do so sooner.

"Limiting regulatory risks for companies interested in going public is essential to keeping U.S. financial markets the best in the world. Far too many companies are unwilling to go public because regulatory barriers are too costly, complex, and time-consuming, making the IPO process less attractive. My bipartisan legislation with Sen. Warnock will help restore the U.S. IPO market by codifying confidential registration rules and allowing companies to 'test the waters.' The aim here is to encourage more businesses to enter public markets and expand investment opportunities for Americans," said Senator Budd.

North Carolina's other U.S. Senator, Republican Thom Tillis, also cosponsored the bill.

"IPOs give companies crucial access to capital markets and drive economic growth. When private companies consider

going public, we should be doing everything possible to make this process easy and to encourage it without jeopardizing investor protections. This bipartisan legislation will reduce unnecessary red-tape and encourage these companies to continue to grow," said Tillis.

Budd, Tillis and Warnock were joined by Chris Van Hollen (D-Md.), and Angela Alsobrooks (D-Md.) in introducing the legislation.

U.S. Representative Ann Wagner (R-Mo.) introduced the legislation in the House of Representatives.

The increased regulatory burden on companies looking to IPO has caused a severe decline in the U.S. IPO market since the early 2000s. Despite this downward trend, the public policy upsides of companies selling shares to the public are significant: the investing public gains access to savings and a wealth-creation opportunity, and the company gains access to capital to continue growing.

The Encouraging Public Offerings Act codifies the SEC administrative changes around confidential registrations into law. It further allows all issuers to "test the waters" prior to an IPO. "Testing the waters" refers to communications between a would-be issuer, accredited institutional buyers, and investors prior to an IPO to gauge interest in

a potential security offering.

Rouzer, bipartisan Primary Care Caucus co-chairs introduce Prioritizing Primary Care Act

U.S. Rep. David Rouzer (R-NC7), along with the bipartisan co-chairs of the Congressional Primary Care Caucus, Representatives Joe Courtney (D-Ct.), Jen Kiggans (R-Va.), and Ami Bera (D-Ca.), introduced H.R. 8765, the Prioritizing Primary Care Act of 2026 to better understand how federal healthcare spending can guide policies to expand primary care access and improve patient outcomes nationwide.

Research consistently shows use of primary care systems are associated with better health outcomes, lower healthcare costs, and improved access to care. Despite these benefits, the United States currently dedicates just five percent of total healthcare spending to primary care. H.R. 8765 requires the federal government to submit reports on primary care spending under federal healthcare programs and establishes a working group on primary care.

"Families across the country, particularly in rural areas like Southeastern North Carolina, continue to face a shortage of primary care providers," said Rouzer. "That shortage makes it harder to access the consistent, preventive care needed to improve health outcomes and save lives. This legislation will help us better understand how federal

healthcare dollars are being spent and how those investments can more effectively support primary care, improve patient outcomes, and thereby lower healthcare costs for patients and taxpayers."

The bill would require federal agencies to submit annual reports to Congress detailing the spe-

cific percentage of healthcare spending allocated to primary care and would establish a federal working group to develop targeted recommendations for expanding the primary care workforce, with a dedicated focus on rural and medically underserved communities.

The Congressional Pri-

mary Care Caucus, originally established in 2015 by Rouzer and Courtney, works to educate Congress on the importance of a comprehensive, continuous, coordinated and patient-centered primary care system for communities across the country.

An autopsy as malpractice

The Democrats couldn't complete their term paper, but handed it in anyway because too many people were wondering what had become of it.

Under pressure, the DNC finally released its autopsy of the 2024 election, after rampant speculation about what it contained and why it hadn't yet been made public. Did it include references to Gaza or didn't it? Why or why not? What explosive revelations were being kept from us?

It turns out that the autopsy is a thoroughly unimpressive, unfinished document that, in the sheer incompetence in its drafting and handling, says more about the low state of the current Democratic Party than any of its analysis.

DNC Chairman Ken Martin maintains that he delayed so long because he didn't want to create a distraction by releasing a poorly done report, which sounds like a typical Washington excuse for hiding something. Except it wasn't. Once everyone saw the report, they realized Martin was right about the embarrassingly poor handiwork of his own outfit.

At the start, the autopsy contains a disclaimer that "the DNC was not provided with the underlying sourcing, interviews or supporting data for many of the assertions contained herein and therefore cannot independently verify the claims presented."

Then, throughout the document, there are hostile annotations casting doubt on its claims. And the report doesn't have a conclusion. The Democrats would have been better off going with ChatGPT.

That said, the report acknowledges that Democrats are out of touch and too dependent on the Republicans making poor candidate choices (something the GOP has done again in its Texas Senate primary with the Trump-endorsed, scandal-plagued Attorney General Ken Paxton).

It notes how Trump's they/them ad hitting Kamala Harris on trans issues was devastating and unanswerable.

It recognizes that Harris didn't do enough to separate herself from Biden and make an affirmative case for herself, rather than relying on voters supposedly considering Trump unacceptable.

On the other hand, it fails to grapple with the issues of inflation and immigration (except to complain about Harris being given a role with some responsibility over the border). These were the two biggest substantive issues in the election, while the autopsy also whiffs on Biden's age and his catastrophically poor judgment in trying to run for reelection. (It also doesn't mention Gaza, bitterly disappointing the anti-Israel left.)

Yet, our expectations for such documents shouldn't be very high. What was the report going to say? That Democrats disgraced themselves by pretending that Biden was fit for a second term, and only shifted course when he got exposed in the first debate, and then had no alternative but to turn to a charmless nonentity as a last-minute substitute?

The history of party retrospectives like this isn't good. Donald Trump won the presidency in 2016 by taking the recommendations of the GOP autopsy after its 2012 election defeat and often doing the opposite in substance and tone.

Democrats may be rudderless and increasingly extreme, but that doesn't mean they won't have a good election night this coming November. Usually, a party that has just lost the White House rises or falls in the midterms based on the incumbent president's job approval rating, rather than its own political creativity or inherent appeal.

As for retaking the White House, that typically depends on nominating someone who is charismatic and fresh, who has an unexpected approach to politics, and who develops a new coalition — think Barack Obama in 2008, or Donald Trump in 2016.

None of this comes about by having a political strategist talk to a bunch of people about the immediate past election and write a long report about it. Needless to say, Democrats should be grateful that the stakes of their autopsy are so low — otherwise, they would have had to endeavor to actually finish it, and grapple with truths about the 2024 election conveniently passed over in the just-released document.

Golf tourney morphs into school reunion

In the wake of the inaugural Alton "Tunney" Brooks Memorial Golf Tournament, it occurred to me that my favorite moment was likely missed by the 250 or so folks who were part of the event as a player, an organizer, a sponsor, a current Pirate athlete or coach, a worker bee, a visitor and on and on.

It was not that we raised about \$70,000, netted more than \$50,000, and that money will be used by the Lumberton High Booster Club to help a badly underfunded athletic program.

It was not that we had a full field of 180 players, and others trying to enter right until we teed off, and that almost half of those players traveled to get here, having a strong affiliation with Lumberton Senior High.

It was not that we distributed \$7,800 in gift certificates to the top-three finishers in the Nicky McKeithan, Finley Read, Alvin Bullock and Ike Bullard divisions, \$2,900 in cash for on-course prizes, dozens of raffle gifts, or that we provided almost 20 golf packages that were gobbled up at discount

prices.

It was not that the weather, which forced a postponement of the original date of May 2, threatened to wash out the rain date, shortened my life, finally cooperated, a brief shower causing a delay that was hardly a nuisance, putting an end to the water torture of watching a 10-day weather forecast daily not once, but twice.

It was not my golf, the lowlight being missing a 3-foot par putt on our third hole and then the mulligan, effectively ending my team's chances of cashing in.

It was not the robust number of people and sponsors who contributed in some way to the golf tournament, or the dozens of old and new friends who traveled distances to support the event. Included were a handful of Lumberton legends, names I knew but not the faces, and coming to realize what a reverence they had for Coach Brooks, and an appreciation that he helped them begin life on the right foot.

It was not the satisfaction of seeing the tournament come together, even with a hitch or two, but largely how I envisioned it when I approached the booster club in January and made bold promises.

It was not that Paul Willoughby, a standout three-sport athlete from the 1960s who agreed to serve as honorary chairman, and several others indicated a desire to remain involved in what will be the Alton "Tunney" Brooks Invitational Golf Tournament

going forward, which will be necessary to sustain and grow the event.

My favorite moment was watching a golf tournament morph into a celebration of not only Brooks, the longtime coach and athletic director, and his legacy, but of Coach Finley Read, his longtime sidekick, as well. Coach Read has been slowed physically by age, but all those years have not dented his strong mind, nor has it robbed him of his desire to make better the lives of others. I watched as he and his wife Ruth arrived,

a line quickly formed of well-wishers and stories were shared and laughs were cheap.

After the first wave of golfers hit the course, I decided to retreat to my nearby home to kill an hour or so. When I returned 90 minutes later, I saw Willoughby, Richie Brooks, Coach Brooks' oldest son and a standout basketball player for his dad, and Randy Stevens, former Lumberton High baseball coach, huddled in the exact same position they had been when I left, still with more stories to tell.

That is when I knew that the tournament was about much more than raising money, but in fact was a reunion with a shared purpose.

Soon I will reach out by email to those who played, asking a series of questions designed to make next year's tournament bigger and better, with an even higher number of Lumberton High graduates.

I think when it comes to this golf tournament, the hard part is over.

Stop working, try waiting

Of the nine Enneagram personality framework types, I am an Enneagram 1. Commonly referred to as “The Reformer” or “The Perfectionist”, Type 1s are motivated by doing things a particular way, following the rules, and pursuing morally or altruistic methods in what they do. Like most things in life that have a spectrum, at our worst, Type 1s can become overbearing or self-reliant, choosing to believe that only they can ensure things get done the right way. Waiting for someone or something else to handle a situation can be an awfully hard thing to do.

Now you don't have to be an Enneagram Type 1 personality to struggle with waiting. We all struggle with this reality in some form or another. We desire to take control of situations, ensuring that the job is done a certain way

or gets done on time. Allowing this approach to command our thinking too much can lead to some dangerous ways of seeing the world and others. For example, thinking this way long enough may cause you to distrust others or possibly believe their calling or skills are not validated or authentic. Thus, we wind up ignoring others or failing to make space for them to live into the person God has created them to be. While it can affect the way we view others, this way of thinking

can also impact how we understand ourselves in relation to God. If we give in to our anxiety about a situation or become overly confident in our own capacity to handle something, we may ignore God's timing or directives and instead take matters into our own hands. Doing so often leads to us missing what God intends, or worse, further exacerbating the problem.

Knowing this is often the direction many of us want to go with our lives — taking the bull by the horns — it is no surprise then that Jesus often tells his followers to do something important... WAIT. For example, take the time in Matthew 14 where Jesus sent the disciples across the Sea of Galilee after dismissing a crowd He had been teaching. The implied directive is for them to go ahead and wait for Him to come to them. This leads to one of Christ's most compelling acts of divine power when he does finally catch up to them, meeting their boat not on the shore, but by walking up to it on the water itself! Then there is poor Thomas, who was not with his colleagues when Jesus made an appearance following His resurrection. Therefore, he had to wait eight days to see the risen Jesus, with those days likely being filled with disgust, frustration and jealousy before finally being able to declare, “My Lord and my God!” (John 20:28) upon seeing Jesus' nail-scarred hands. Or take one final grand example, where Jesus told the disciples that the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, would come to His followers after He had left (John 14:23-27), and yet, it was some 10 days after his ascension that the Spirit made its grand arrival at the annual celebration of Pentecost (Acts 1-2).

Waiting is something the Lord asks of faith-followers repeatedly, but why? First, waiting causes us to acknowledge the discomfort we are experiencing. One of the nice things about a situation being resolved quickly is that we get to avoid any of the tension, anxiety or pain that may accompany it. However, being forced to wait forces us to lean in rather than lean away from a problem. Tension and crisis are normal parts of the human experience, and owning up to what we are feeling can provide us with the opportunity to grow as a result of those experiences.

Second, waiting keeps us from making a situation worse. As we noted above, often when we rush to resolve a problem, in our haste, we may only make it worse. We may not have all of the information, or even know what questions to ask, but taking our time ensures we allow the process to mature and that we don't become controlled by our fear. Then third, after we have come to grips with what we are feeling, and confidently moved ourselves out of the way, the Spirit can now step in to reveal what our next role in God's story is. As the examples above showed, often the waiting can lead to pretty special outcomes. Whether those outcomes are of a grand scale or wind up being a simple solution, they are all impactful because they come from the direction of God, not the direction of our own hearts.

While waiting may be a difficult practice for us all, it is undoubtedly a spiritual practice. It is an act of faith, of trust and letting go. The part that Jesus often commands us to play in his story is to wait. Wait so that the Spirit can lead us into following Christ in the world, wherever He may already be at work. So in the week to come, may you endeavor not so much to work to resolve all that ails you, but pursue the holy practice of waiting for God to reveal the next faithful step forward.

in was delayed due to a months-long protest by challenger Duron Burney.

Animal control

Randy Ivey addressed town council about the need for more animal control within the town to reduce the number of stray cats.

Multiple citizens echoed Ivey's concerns.

"Cats are over running my yard, and I can't even plant a garden," said Emanuel Pittman.

The problem seems to be that the county is responsible for managing the control of animals in Red Springs and it may take a while to get there.

To report issues regarding stray animals, contact the town man-

ager's office at 217 South Main St., Red Springs, NC 28377.

The town does not directly trap or remove animals but can refer the public to the proper agency.

Budget updates

Town Manager Shanelle Harris presented updates to the current town budget.

Red Springs has improved its audit performance from the 2023-24 fiscal year. The Electric Fund as well as the Water and Sewer Fund each remain profitable and stable.

Red Springs was awarded a \$100,000 grant by the Office of State Budget and Management. Half of the OSBM grant will go to build a new splash pad that is set to open this month. The added benefit of the splash

pad is that the Mill Village neighborhood will have much better water pressure from the rerouting of the pipes for the splash pad.

Town council is currently seeking candidates for seasonal positions to assist in operating the splash pad.

The budget also includes improvements to Chavis-Locklear Park. Additions include a new press box, a covered shelter, a storage building and furnishings.

New patrol vehicles

Red Springs has leased five new police cruisers from Enterprise Fleet. The previous vehicles had over 150,000 miles or more and many of them were 2012 or older models.

Reduction of Service

The town is looking to start outsourcing

waste collection. The sanitation department is currently working at a loss. About 40% of the work week is spent on sanitation alone. The three employees that are currently working for sanitation spend 20% of their time grass cutting, 20% on white goods/bulk, 20% on leaf and limb trimming and a whopping 40% on trash collection.

Outsourcing the collection of trash reduce the pickup to one day a week instead of two, and would result in more time for the current employees to handle other tasks for the town.

Hometown hero

T.J. Ellerbe was recognized for his excellence in athletics.

The Red Springs High School senior averaged 18.7 yards per catch, made 14 touchdowns

and had 1234 receiving yards as a wide receiver during his career as the team's wide receiver.

His stats place him as one of the most elite receivers in the state.

Ellerbe is not only a football star but is ranked as the second-best long jumper on the track team in the high school's history.

Also, an honor roll student, Ellerbe was offered and accepted a full scholarship to attend UNC Pembroke.

Henderson said that Ellerbe was, "a beacon of light for our community" and complemented Ellerbe on his "strong leadership skills and character."

The next board meeting will be held at 7 p.m. on July 7 at Red Springs Town Hall on Main Street.

of South Florida, the University of California, San Diego and Ohio State. More than 50 more college chapters, including at Harvard, Brown, Duke, Cornell and Yale, are scheduled to launch in 2027.

Shift Toward Hope is

pursuing over \$82 million in SAMHSA grant funding to continue expanding the reach and impact of their initiatives.

Hansberry hopes the nonprofit will bring more resources to southeastern North Carolina.

"I'm very passionate about helping Pembroke and Robeson County address the mental health shortage," he said. "We want to partner with local

organizations and businesses to help make a difference here."

Hansberry credits his studies in mass communication with helping him think through how to effectively raise awareness of mental health.

"Being a mass comm major, we're always thinking about how to reach people on a larger scale," he said. "That mindset helped shape how we

share these ideas with the public."

Faculty members say Hansberry's determination and empathy stand out.

"Donavin is very self-reliant, self-motivated and ambitious," said Jamie Litty, professor of mass communication. "But what stands out most is his empathy. He genuinely wants to help children and families understand

mental health."

Litty said Hansberry frequently sought advice and carefully worked through complex ideas as he developed his projects.

"I believe in what he is doing," she said. "He has found a home in our department."

For Hansberry, success is measured not by personal recognition but by the impact the organization can make.

"At this stage in my life, success means having the opportunity to help more people," Hansberry said. "Something positive came out of a very difficult moment. We want to make sure no one feels like their only option is left to chance."

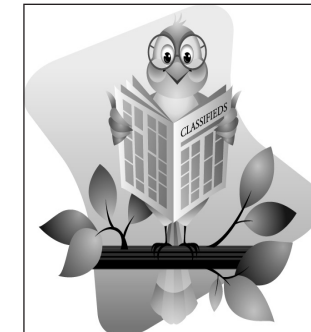

Video shows moment truck-driving preacher helps thwart alleged kidnapping in SC

AIKEN, S.C. — A truck-driving preacher who helped thwart an alleged kidnapping attempt in South Carolina — all caught on his rig's dashboard camera — said Thursday that he was not a hero, but a "divine" tool.

Anthony J. Moore, 53, was driving a route in Aiken County, about 20 miles (32 kilometers) from the Georgia border, last Friday when a woman ran directly into his path with her hands cuffed behind her back.

The video, which has no sound, shows the drama unfold: The woman passes in front of the truck, and a man in a Cadillac that had been on the side of the road swerves in front of the truck before taking off. The woman then runs down the road, and the man drives off.

"I just see it as a divine assignment from God, because had not I been there with the dashcam ... they probably wouldn't have caught the footage that needed to be caught," Moore told The Associated Press in a telephone interview. "It was another assignment from God, a special assignment from God. That a life needed to be saved."

Authorities arrested Jonathan Willard, 39, of New Ellenton, on one count each of kidnapping and impersonation of a law enforcement officer. He was being held Thursday at the Aiken County Detention Center.

According to an incident report from the Aiken County Sheriff's Department, the woman was taking a walk when a man in a green Cadillac "came from behind her and told her he was with the police." She said he took her phone and Social Security card, put her in handcuffs and placed her in the back seat of the car. The woman told police

that the man pulled over by a gated property and got out. She said she tried to open the rear doors, but they were locked.

As the man rummaged through the trunk, she said, she climbed over the seat and escaped through the open driver's side door.

Moore was driving south of Aiken when he saw the woman running toward him.

"I let my window down and she said, 'Please help me. He's trying to kidnap me,'" Moore said.

As the woman swerved, Moore said, the man chasing her pulled up beside him and showed "what looks to be a badge."

"And he said, 'I'm with law enforcement, and she jumped out of my car,'" Moore recounted. The man then left in the Cadillac.

Bystanders called 911, helped get the cuffs off the woman and gave her water. Moore said she told him that she had just graduated the day before, and that the man had also taken her diploma.

She asked Moore if he would accompany her back to the spot where she escaped, to see if the man had might have dumped her belongings. He said they found nothing.

The Aiken County Solicitor's Office said Willard had not yet been assigned a defense attorney and no court dates had been scheduled. The AP called the jail to speak with Willard, but the request was denied.

Moore is pastor of Amazing Grace Ministries in Denmark, South Carolina. Moore is also a 27-year Army veteran, said his wife, Betty, an associate pastor at the church.

"When I learned that he was caught the next day I was relieved of a lot of things that he didn't get away," he said, "to go try that again someplace else."

SC probe into fake IDs leads to ICE detention of 48 immigrants

ABBEVILLE, S.C. — A two-year investigation into immigrants with fake identity documents led to federal officials detaining 48 workers at a South Carolina metal casting business and six people facing state charges, including two top managers at the plant, authorities announced Thursday.

Dozens of officials with federal and local law enforcement agencies raided Burnstein von Seelen Precision Castings in Abbeville on Wednesday.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers took the workers

into custody on alleged immigration violations, and the company's plant manager and human resources director were arrested on allegations they knowingly hired immigrants in the U.S. illegally, state Attorney General Alan Wilson said at a news conference.

The company officials were indicted by a state grand jury, along with four other people accused of making and selling false U.S. and state identifications using information from identity thefts.

"We want to send a message that this isn't about going after people who are trying to feed their family," Wilson said.

"This isn't going after companies or businesses who unknowingly hiring illegal. This is about going after something much larger, you know, a conspiracy of people around South Carolina to steal identities, to create fake Social Security cards, fake driver's license, fake immigration documents."

Officials at Burnstein von Seelen did not immediately return messages left by phone and through its website.

The two company managers were expected to appear at the Richland County Courthouse in Columbia on Thursday to face charges of criminal conspiracy and

identity fraud to obtain employment. It was not immediately clear if they had lawyers who could respond to the allegations.

Burnstein von Seelen, founded in 1985, is a metals casting business, using different alloys of copper, brass and bronze to make an array of components, according to its website. It's located in Abbeville County, population around 25,000, in western South Carolina not far from the Georgia line, about 90 miles (145 kilometers) west of Columbia.

ICE officials said they were reviewing the immigration status of the 48 workers who were

detained, who they said included people who have had previous encounters with ICE and some who were previously ordered deported.

Authorities said the investigation is continuing and more indictments and arrests were possible.

State officials began the probe began in October 2024. At the time it started, local law enforcement officials were frustrated by a lack of federal enforcement efforts against false identifications and identity theft under President Joe Biden's administration, Wilson said. That changed, he said, when President

Donald Trump took office last year, and federal authorities joined the state investigation, he said.

Wednesday's raid at the plant was not typical of Trump's mass deportation efforts that have garnered criticism. Immigration raids at businesses have been a relatively small part of the deportation campaign, and state officials played a leading role in the South Carolina investigation.

Officials approached the investigation in ways similar to drug probes, said prosecutor Creighton Waters, pursuing not just the people using the phony documentation but those supplying it.

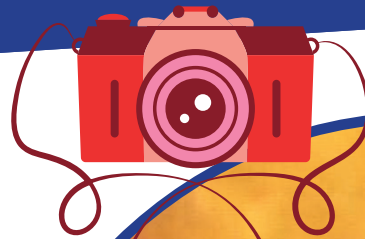

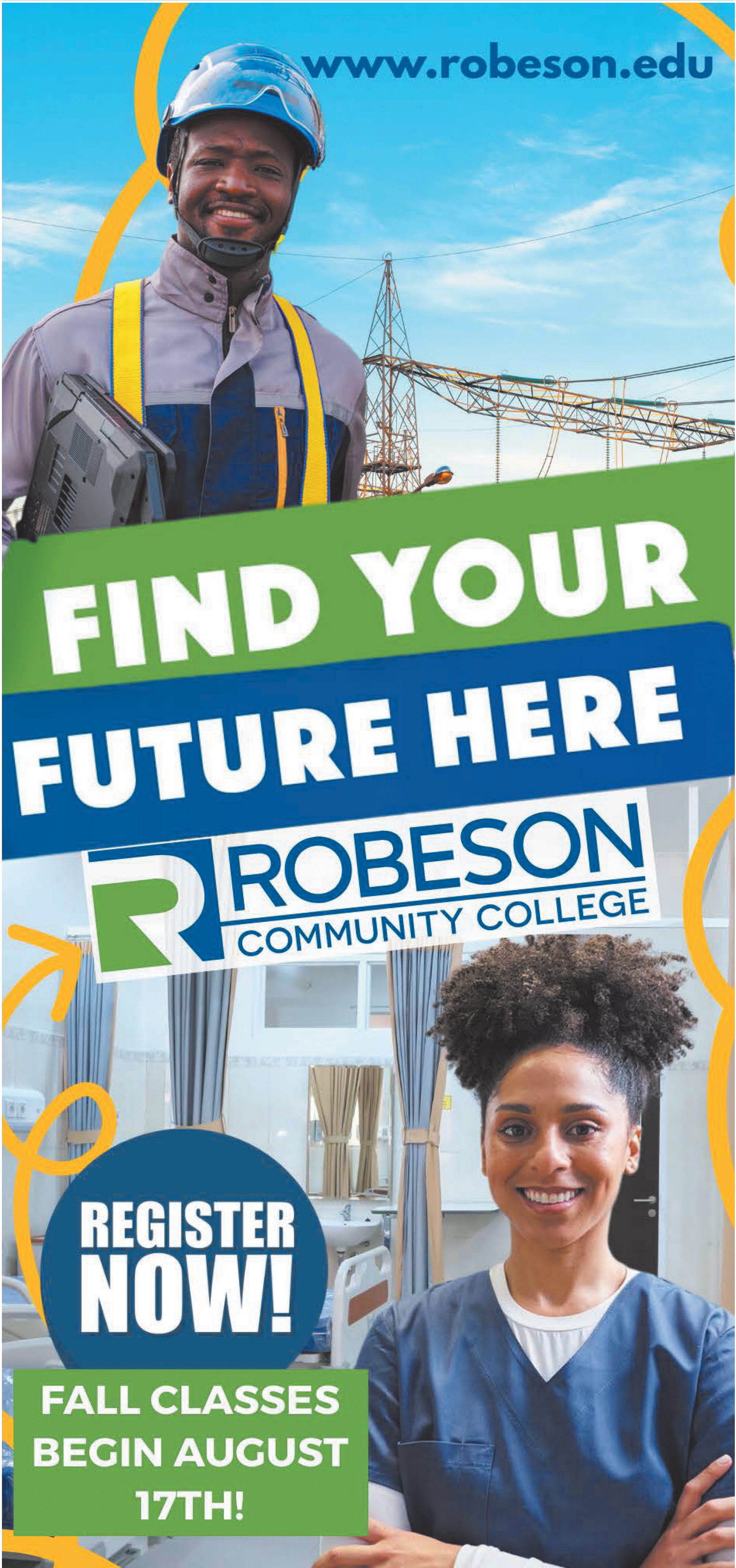

Hammonds was a dominant force for Lumberton, en route to winning Robeson County Player

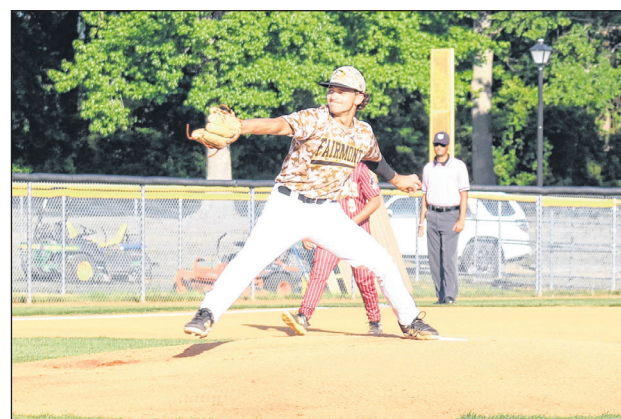
of the Year honors as a senior, putting up 14.7 points and 8.7 rebounds per game, shooting an impressive 70% from the field.

Stanley Cup Final is 'a new series' going to Game 3

LAS VEGAS — Before the Carolina Hurricanes made their comeback, before the Vegas Golden Knights needed a goal with 81 seconds left in regulation to tie it and before Seth Jarvis scored in overtime, the sound of Game 2 of the Stanley Cup Final was silence.

The same crowd that roared at the start of the series was stunned, with their beloved Hurricanes shut out through the first two periods for the first time since mid-January. They were fewer than 15 minutes away from a 2-0 hole that only five of 55 teams have overcome to hoist the Cup.

The topsy-turvy ride that followed ended with Carolina winning in emotional fashion and making this a competitive series between two of the best teams in the NHL. Game 3 is Saturday night in Las Vegas.

If it is anything like the first two, it is best to expect the unexpected the rest of the way.

"It's obviously a new series, a five-game series now," said defenseman Shayne Gostisbehere, who leads the Hurricanes with three points so far in the final. "A lot of emotions throughout the games, too. For almost 50 minutes there it's kind of low, and then kind of even, then really high, then low again, and then high. It's a roller coaster for sure."

This final is shaping up to be more like a seesaw, with wild momentum swings back and forth. This is the first Cup final in league history in which each of the first two games featured a multigoal comeback victory.

Carolina is now the first team in 82 years to win a game in the final when by more than one goal within the final 10 minutes of regulation. That would also make Vegas — which fell behind by two goals in the opener — the first team since 1944 to blow such a lead.

"The sport of hockey is funny that way," Golden Knights center William Karlsson said Friday. "I think that's why we all love it. It can go either way at any times But it's hockey. It's a game of mistakes, and it's bound to happen."

The Hurricanes after cruising through the first three rounds with 12 wins and just one loss met their match in Vegas, and that was evident in Game 1. What also became clear is that neither of team is going to get pushed around for an entire night, even if there are stretches of domination by one side or the other.

"It's going to be hard to play your best game — that's the point," Carolina coach Rod Brind'Amour said. "It would be great if you could do it for the whole 60 minutes. But it's probably not going to be that way because they're a very, very good team."

Counterpart John Tortorella emphasized that again before he and his team flew home, insisting he likes where Vegas is at two games into its biggest challenge yet this postseason. The Golden Knights have stolen home-ice advantage and get to play the next two on The Strip, where Tortorella can better control matchups.

"There's no difference," Tortorella said. "We're going to play. We know how to play. We know how we want to play."

So do the Hurricanes, and it's what they displayed at the end of Game 2. Logan Stankoven provided the spark, Mark Jankowski kept it going and Jordan Staal scored on a power play after Tortorella's failed goaltender interference challenge became a difference-making moment.

Of course, the Golden Knights dominating for much of the first two periods and the start of the third showed why they've been such a buzz-saw since Tortorella took over in late March. Brind'Amour acknowledged the vibes around his team were better than they could have been if not for the turnaround, but neither team should expect to feel too good about itself for too long in a series like this.

Players are embracing that as part of the fun. "This is exciting," Jarvis said. "This is what playoff hockey's all about is tight games and momentum swings, and you never really know what's going to happen next. I don't think you can ask any more of a playoff series."

Jarvis' OT goal caps Canes' stunning Game 2 comeback

RALEIGH — The Carolina Hurricanes looked a step behind, down two goals and chasing a tested team filled with Stanley Cup winners from three years ago. And the pressure had been building for weeks on Seth Jarvis and the power play.

"Somebody had to step up and make a play," coach Rod Brind'Amour said simply.

A shocking third-period comeback changed everything, both in getting the Hurricanes back in the Stanley Cup Final and setting the stage for Jarvis and that power-play unit to get a needed breakthrough moment.

Jarvis blasted a one-timer past Carter Hart on a power play at 3:56 of overtime to lift the Hurricanes past the Vegas Golden Knights, 4-3 on Thursday night. That ended a night that saw Carolina trail 2-0 entering the third period after looking outmatched through the second, rally with three unanswered goals, then regroup after giving up a tying goal late to force the OT.

Just as importantly, the Hurricanes went from staring at an 0-2 series deficit after losing twice at home to heading West for Game 3 on Saturday in a tied series after an abrupt turn of fortune.

The time was coming, the Hurricanes kept insisting, when their top-line guys and the power play would make big plays.

Turns out, they were right.

"This is exciting, this is what playoff hockey is all about," said Jarvis, who admitted the winning score was a "huge" weight off his shoulders. "It's tight games and momentum swings and you never really know what's going to happen next."

Unexpected comeback

Indeed, Vegas' roster filled with Cup winners from 2023 looked every bit in control of this one. Yet the Hurricanes pulled off a comeback that will earn a spot in franchise lore alongside moments like the 2002 "Molson Miracle" at Montreal — when they rallied from a 3-0 hole entering the

third before winning in 4-3 OT in Round 2 — or the 2009 first-round shocker at New Jersey when the Hurricanes scored twice in the final 80 seconds for another 4-3 win in Game 7.

It started with a tough effort by Logan Stankoven to beat Rasmus Andersson for a puck along the boards before coming behind the net to throw one off the skate of Jeremy Lauzon in the crease to slip by Hart for a life-infusing score at the 10:20 mark.

Mark Jankowski followed, coming when linemate William Carrier kept the entry alive while tussling with Lauzon and fed him for a score. This one stuck, coming after Jankowski had an overtime winner waved off in Game 2 of the first-round series against Ottawa and a second goal later waved off against Philadelphia for a goaltender-interference review on Carrier.

"It's nice to sit on the bench and look over and see they're not challenging it," Jankowski said.

Even more surprising, the power play carried the Hurricanes home.

Jarvis, power play come through in clutch

Carolina's power play entered the night just 7 of 58 (12.1%) in the playoffs after ranking fourth in the regular season at 24.9%. But, that unit struck twice to change everything on Thursday night, first with captain Jordan Staal redirecting Shayne Gostisbehere's shot to beat Carter Hart from the top of the crease for

a 3-2 lead with the man advantage.

Then, after Vegas got a tying goal off Mark Stone's skate with 1:21 left in regulation — coming when Hurricanes defenseman Jacob Slavin knocking a loose rebound past Frederik Andersen into the net while clear the crease — Carolina came up with a rousing response in OT.

The fact it was Jarvis who got it only magnified the scope of the moment. The winning blast marked only the fourth goal of the playoffs for Jarvis, a top-line forward who led the team with 32 regular-season goals and played for Canada's silver-medalist team at the Milan Cortina Olympics.

Brind'Amour had said multiple times in recent weeks that the Sebastian Aho-centered line featuring Jarvis and Andrei Svechnikov had largely played other top lines to even. The Hurricanes had rolled to a 12-1 record through the Eastern Conference playoffs while the Stankoven-centered second line or the third line featuring open-ice

speedster Nikolaj Ehlers carried the scoring.

But Brind'Amour cautioned Wednesday: "We need them to get going."

And after Vegas went ahead 2-0 on Brett Howden's second terrific individual effort, Brind'Amour swapped Jarvis with Jordan Martinook midway through the second period to put Jarvis alongside Ehlers and Staal — a move that led to an immediate goal for Jarvis in Game 2 of the second-round series against the Flyers.

This time, Jarvis buried the shot from the left circle off a feed from Gostisbehere up top. A crowd buzzing since the start of the third-period comeback erupted, with Jarvis skating toward the blue line and dropping to one knee to slide across the ice.

The win improved Carolina to 6-0 in overtime during the playoffs. That includes all four Game 2s in this postseason at home.

"It was desperation," Stankoven said. "I think we needed to try to get that split tonight."

Busch's wife, family thank fans for support after his death

CONCORD — Samantha Busch, the wife of two-time NASCAR champion Kyle Busch, who died last month at the age of 41, has issued a statement on behalf of her family to thank fans for their support.

In an Instagram post on Friday, Samantha and the Busch's children, Brexton and Lennix, wrote: "The prayers, messages, flowers, meals, hugs, and countless acts of kindness have carried us through the most heartbreaking days of our lives. While our hearts are absolutely shattered, we have felt God's presence and arms wrapped tightly around

us through each and every one of you."

Busch died May 21 after severe pneumonia progressed into sepsis, resulting in rapid and overwhelming complications, according to a statement released by the family soon after his death. According to his death certificate, Busch had pneumonia for "days to weeks."

Busch's unexpected death devastated the NASCAR community.

He was thought to have had a sinus cold while racing at Watkins Glen on May 10 and radioed in to his team saying that he needed a "shot" from a doctor after the race.

He continued racing and won the Truck Series race at Dover before finishing 17th in the All-Star race, five days before his death.

Busch also attended the

opening of a go-kart track with 11-year-old Brexton days before his death.

Friday's message on social media was the first statement from his wife

and children.

"The love that has surrounded our family during this unimaginable time has brought comfort in the middle of so much pain," Samantha Busch wrote. "Knowing the impact Kyle had on others and seeing how they are honoring him through each unique act of generosity is a true testament to how special Kyle is to so many people. There are moments when the weight of this loss feels impossible to carry, yet time and time again God, through you all, has shown us we are not alone.

"From family and friends to fans and com-

plete strangers, thank you for showing up for us.

Thank you for loving our family so well. Thank you for loving Kyle. Thank you for honoring him. We may never find the words to fully express what your support has meant to us, but please know that we are deeply grateful."

Busch won Cup Series championships in 2015 and 2019 for Joe Gibbs Racing. The younger brother of NASCAR driver Kurt Busch, Kyle Busch won a record 234 combined races across NASCAR's top three national series. He had 63 Cup victories and added 102 O'Reilly Auto Parts wins and 69 Trucks victories.

NASCAR HOF driver, broadcaster Ned Jarrett dies at 93

NEWTON — Ned Jarrett, a two-time NASCAR Cup Series champion and longtime broadcaster, died Thursday of natural causes in his home, his family announced. He was 93.

Jarrett was inducted into the NASCAR Hall of Fame in 2011 after 50 career wins on the sport's top circuit, including championships in 1961 and 1965. He was part of the second five-member NASCAR Hall of Fame class.

Jarrett, known as

"Gentleman Ned" for his demeanor, may have been better known by younger NASCAR fans for his broadcasting career. One of his signature moments in the booth came in the 1993 Daytona 500 when he didn't try to restrain from rooting as his son, Dale Jarrett, held off Dale Earnhardt for the win.

Dale Jarrett won the Cup Series in 1999. The Jarretts became the second father-son combination to win Cup Series championships, following Lee and Richard Petty. Bill Elliott and his son, Chase, later

completed the father-son achievement.

NASCAR CEO Steve O'Donnell said Ned Jarrett was a racing legend.

"Despite his calm demeanor, 'Gentleman' Ned Jarrett was as fierce a competitor as NASCAR has ever seen," O'Donnell said in a statement. "His on-track accomplishments speak for themselves with wins and championships across several NASCAR divisions.

"But it was his off-the-track persona that separated Ned from his peers. He was as kind as his nickname indicated.

And his endearing personality helped him excel in his second career as a broadcaster. Ned was an outstanding ambassador for the sport for more than six decades and he will be dearly missed."

Jarrett's family described him as "a devout Christian and a devoted, loving family man."

"He was a friend to everyone he met and NASCAR's oldest living champion," Jarrett's family said in a statement. "By all accounts, he was a true NASCAR legend. While

New York in frenzy for Knicks' 1st Finals since '99

NEW YORK — Jalen Brunson was wowed upon hearing how high the price had climbed on the secondary market for the cheapest ticket in New York for Game 3 of the NBA Finals between the Knicks and Spurs.

What left the Knicks star nearly stumped was determining what he would deem worthy of spending \$7,500 to go see. "That's a good question," Brunson said Thursday. He paused for a few seconds before delivering his answer: "A live Michael Jackson performance."

Thriller, indeed. From Bay Ridge to the Bronx and beyond, the Big Apple has gone nuts for the Knicks.

The team is not only in the NBA Finals for the first time in 27 years, New York is riding a 12-0 roll after rallying from a 14-point second-half deficit in a 105-95 win at

San Antonio in Game 1 on Wednesday night. Game 2 was played Friday night in San Antonio, with the result unavailable at press time, before the series shifts to New York on Monday.

It seems as if the entire city is on board. There were the thousands who filled Madison Square Garden to watch the game on the big screen, only to be matched by the thousands more celebrating outside in the shadow of the Empire State Building lit up in the Knicks' blue and orange.

The MTA — the city's transit authority — got into the spirit by painting several subway stops around the arena in Knicks colors. And Mayor Zohran Mamdani even signed an executive order temporarily lifting children's bedtime hours.

"Knicks in Four!" chants erupted shortly after midnight, as fans climbed light posts and even on an ambulance outside of MSG.

Similar scenes were captured at a free watch party in Central Park, and across the five boroughs.

At a bar in Brooklyn, fans spilled out onto the outside sidewalk to watch the game on the TV inside. At a pizzeria a few doors down, fans gathered around a flat screen TV someone erected in the trunk of a car.

All of this for a chance to be a part of what could be history 53 years in the making, since Willis Reed and company last brought an NBA title to what was and evidently remains a basketball-mad metropolis. The buzz in the city has overwhelmed much talk of the World Cup, which opens in a week.

"Honestly, I just feel grateful to be here and experience the New York Knicks, doing what we haven't done in a long time," Owen Odigie said, celebrating the Game 1 win inside Madison Square Garden. "It's special. It's beautiful."

Knicks forward Karl-

Anthony Towns could feel the Big Apple energy some 1,800 miles away in San Antonio following Game 1.

"You feel the energy in the city, the grit, the grind, the hard work you've got to put in to make it in the city," said Towns, who hails from New Jersey. "I think we reflect all our fans ... when we step on that court with a Knicks jersey."

Knicks fans even made their presence felt in San Antonio, beyond the familiar celebrities of Spike Lee, Tracy Morgan, Timothee Chalamet, Ben Stiller and more. The crowd in San Antonio was made up of an estimated 20% Knicks fans, some of whom made their voices heard in yelling, "Let's go, Knicks," during the national anthem.

In reality, given the soaring prices at home, it was reasonably cheaper for Knicks fans to make the trip to San Antonio, even when taking into account flight and lodging

costs. Tickets for Game 1 started at around \$750 on the secondary market.

Spurs guard Julian Champagnie — a native New Yorker — wasn't surprised to see the Knicks contingent.

"I kind of expected that," Champagnie said. "I'm from New York. I know how New York fans travel and stuff like that, so I kind of expected that."

Towns said he couldn't be more appreciative of the love being shown by

Knicks fans. But he said he also prays for the New York police officers tasked with keeping people safe amid the frenzy.

"All those men and women out there that are not only protecting everybody ... they are huge fans of the Knicks and support the Knicks fans in their ability to show how much they love the Knicks and being as lenient as possible without causing chaos," Towns said. "So, shout-out to the men and women of the NYPD."

THE SKINNY Summer pool party safety tips

A backyard pool opens the door to an endless source of summertime memories. There may be no better place to gather when the sun is shining and the heat is blazing than the cooling waters of a backyard pool. Although a pool can be an enjoyable and relaxing home feature, it also carries significant responsibilities.

Recent findings from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission show that drowning and submersions among children remain high. In 2020, 339 children younger than age 15 fatally drowned, and in 2021, that figure rose by 12%. Young children (age 5 and under) represent 75% of child drowning deaths and 77% of nonfatal injuries.

Pool safety concerns and drowning incidents are largely preventable. By staying up-to-date on safety standards and being vigilant when hosting others, people can ensure that the pool remains a place to relax and have fun.

Create physical barriers

Modern safety standards require separating the pool from the neighbors and the rest of the home and yard. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention say a fence that is at least four feet tall that completely surrounds the water can reduce a child's drowning risk by up to 83%, compared to three-sided property-line fencing. Gates should be self-closing and self-latching, and entryways to the pool should swing outward away from the water. New smart lock technology can alert homeowners if a gate is left open.

Visual supervision

No technology can replace a human. Someone should be enlisted to watch the water anytime someone is swimming, and especially when larger crowds during a party will be using the pool. The person should have no phone, book or other distractions, and should remain sober. The CPSC suggests this "water watcher" handle the task for a set period of time and then can be rotated out. Those hosting a party may want to hire a life-guard, even if they have an above-ground pool, to ensure the safety of all swimmers.

Establish firm rules

While pools can be fun, it's essential that everyone behave safely when in and around the water. Party hosts can set rules, such as no running or diving. People may consider

UNCP student to release new album

PEMBROKE — University of North Carolina at Pembroke student Kaden Ryan is preparing to release the fifth album of his career, "Hold Me Here," on June 26.

Ryan, only 20 years old, has spent his free time writing music. He wrote songs in the margins of his notes, story drafts, and anywhere he could put pencil to paper.

"By 2023, I had an instrumental tape," Ryan said, "and I started writing lyrics to that. I produced the tape in Garage Band, and it was really just a bunch of loops I put together, but it really taught me the ins and outs of producing."

While working on his debut album, Ryan was studying at UNC Wilmington before transferring to UNCP's online system. He calls that first album a "scrapbook" of his time at Wilmington.

While he had access to a recording studio at the university, the time limit meant many of the songs on that first album had the end of their vocals recorded while Ryan sat in his car after spending hours in the booth.

While this is his fifth album overall, it is the first that he has not produced completely solo.

removing large floats or extra toys from the pool water, which can hinder sight lines and mask someone floundering or drowning. Additional rules may prohibit drink-

ing alcoholic beverages and swimming, or having separate swim times for children and adults, as larger adults might overwhelm the pool and make swimming more challenging for younger swimmers.

Keep safety gear nearby

Rescue equipment,

such as a shepherd's hook and a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life ring, should be poolside at all times. At least one person in the household should be trained in CPR. Survival rates and neurological outcomes for drowning victims improve considerably when CPR can be admin-

istered immediately, says the American Heart Association.

Planning a pool party requires more than making sure water chemicals are balanced and there are refreshments available. Ensuring that swimmers remain safe should be the utmost priority.

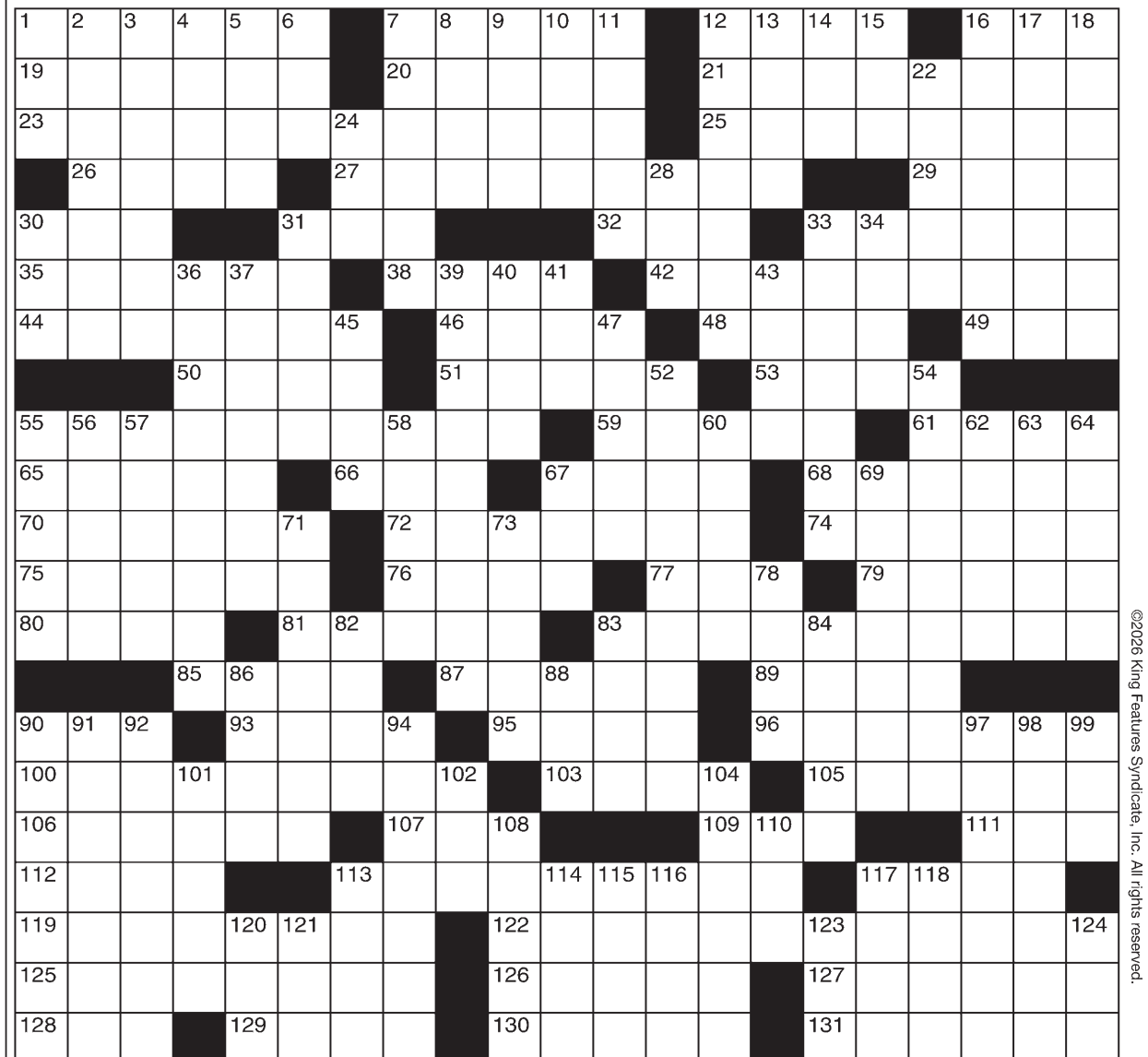

A pitch for cancer screening

With age comes wisdom. Many adults can quickly observe when they are feeling under the weather. This helps identify diseases like the common cold that are diagnosed in large part through characteristic symptoms. Other diseases like cancer brood long before symptoms arise. Let's round the bases for cancer screening awareness.

First: How does cancer cause symptoms?

The human body is made of cells that normally grow and die. Cancer refers to diseases of abnormal cell growth. These abnormally growing cells eventually push on nearby stuff or clog up pathways and disrupt normal bodily functions. This results in symptoms. It is important to emphasize that abnormal cell growth happens first. The disruption to bodily function, and the symptoms that result, happen sometime after the cancer begins.

Second: Why not just cut out cancer when it appears?

Surgical removal of cancerous growth is part of the recommended treatment for early forms of cancer. However, many cancers grow deep to the visible surface of the body. Furthermore, cancerous cells can fall off the original site of abnormal growth, travel through vessels and seed far away. This process is called metastasis. If a cancer has metastasized to many distant sites before it is discovered, surgical removal of all cancerous cells from the body is essentially impossible.

Third: Why is my doctor recommending all these different cancer screenings?

Your doctor may be trying to catch cancer before it grows large and metastasizes. Generally, there are more options for treatment, and a higher likelihood of eradicating all cancerous cells, the earlier a cancer is discovered.

Home: We all die sometime, right?

This is a common thought during the conversation around cancer. It seems to serve death itself while denying the moments leading up to it. I wonder if it's a way to deny painful thoughts and feelings experienced while having watched others decline before passing away from cancer. Your cancer screening may produce wonderful or heart-wrenching news for you. Either way, your screen is an opportunity to reflect with courageous resolution on your experience with cancer and role model for the loved ones behind you.

That's the ball game: What should I do next?

Ask your primary care doctor what cancer screening is right for you. Different cancer screening is recommended based on age, sex assigned at birth and lifestyle. Some cancer screening occurs once in the lifetime, and others occur multiple times at regular intervals. Attend primary care appointments either annually or otherwise so your provider can help you stay up to date on your recommended cancer screening.

Mixed federal messages on drug checking leave NC harm reduction programs in limbo

For the third year in a row, drug overdose deaths in the U.S. have trended downward. North Carolina had one of the largest year-over-year decreases — a nearly 29% drop in overdose deaths from the end of 2024 to 2025.

Substance use experts worry these hard-fought gains could now be in jeopardy as President Donald Trump's administration chips away at funding for addiction programs and some key evidence-based overdose prevention tools.

Most recently, the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration banned the use of the agency's grant funding to support some harm reduction interventions. Among the items federal officials have said agencies can't spend money on: sterile syringes that prevent the spread of diseases and rapid test strips that detect harmful additives in street drugs.

Harm reduction is a public health approach that aims to minimize the ill effects associated with drug use — to prevent the spread of disease and help people stay alive and connect with support services. These interventions acknowledge the realities of drug use, prevent overdose deaths and drive down rates of infection.

Recently, the Trump administration has discouraged such harm reduction interventions, saying that they only facilitate illegal drug use. The updated guidance from SAMHSA released in a "Dear Colleague" letter in April is a continuation of a similar letter released last summer in which the agency described its shift away from harm reduction.

Those who work directly with people who use drugs say the federal agency's new guidance conflicts with other national policies and could have far-reaching consequences on different streams of funding. They also say the crackdown on drug testing strips could not have come at a worse time due to the heavily adulterated street drug supply.

Ever-changing street drug supply

The street drug supply

has become increasingly contaminated by different substances — from benign additives like caffeine to veterinary tranquilizer xylazine, which can cause severe skin wounds. Meanwhile, the extremely potent and deadly opioid fentanyl has been pressed into counterfeit prescription pills and sold as Xanax or Percocet to the unwitting.

"I know people personally who have taken something — thinking it was one thing and it was something else — and lost their life," said Greg Berry, director of the Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion and Deflection programs at the North Carolina Harm Reduction Coalition. "They're unprepared. They don't have naloxone. They're not thinking that they're taking the opioid."

Drug testing strips give people real-time information about what's in the substance they're using and allows them an opportunity to make safer choices. The knowledge could lead someone to perhaps acquire naloxone, to use less of a substance, or to use in the presence of someone who can get medical help if it's needed.

Berry said he has even seen the results of a rapid drug checking test — or more detailed results from the Street Drug Analysis Lab at UNC — be the catalyst for someone to seek addiction treatment.

The stakes are especially high with contaminants such as xylazine, which has become prevalent in the circulating supply. The substance often causes chronic soft tissue injuries that can worsen over time. Berry, who has been conducting community health education campaigns about what's in the drug supply, calls it a silent killer. He said he knows three people who died from complications from their wounds.

Harm reduction pioneer Louise Vincent had an adverse reaction to xylazine a few years ago; it contributed to her subsequent death in 2025.

Unpublished survey research Berry conducted with a researcher at Fayetteville State University found that among people in Cumberland County who

self-reported exposure to xylazine, more than four in 10 said they developed wounds. Of those, 32% reported mild wounds, 51% reported moderate wounds requiring medical treatment, and 17% reported severe wounds requiring extensive care or resulting in long-term complications.

Meanwhile, new adulterants crop up in the street drug supply all the time. In the past year, the Street Drug Analysis Lab at UNC has documented a rise in medetomidine — a sedative used in hospitals to keep surgery patients and infants on ventilators comfortable. The lab, which tests drugs mailed in anonymously from harm reduction programs across the country, has analyzed more than 21,500 samples from 202 programs in 44 states and detected 514 unique substances.

According to the lab's latest newsletter, medetomidine has been identified in at least 14 states and appears to be replacing xylazine in prevalence. In an analysis of more than 11,000 specimens, researchers found that samples containing medetomidine were 12 times more likely to be associated with hallucinations — an effect not typically seen with opioid use.

Unlike xylazine, which causes visible wounds, medetomidine is most dangerous when people try to stop using it, according to the UNC lab researchers. Withdrawal symptoms start within a day of last use and can trigger cardiac problems severe enough to require hospitalization, the researchers wrote. Harm reduction workers in Pittsburgh are now directing people whose drugs may contain medetomidine to bypass methadone clinics and go straight to an emergency room if they plan to stop using.

Given how quickly the drug supply changes, Berry and the UNC lab researchers argue that drug checking is one of the most crucial tools to protect those who use drugs.

Sowing fear and uncertainty

Beyond the immediate ban on drug checking supplies, experts say the federal guidance creates uncertainty that

could ripple beyond SAMHSA-funded programs.

Berry worries that the agency's position will influence other funders and organizations in the public health system.

"Even if they're not receiving those funds, they still take direction from them," Berry said. "[SAMHSA] saying 'We're no longer supporting that' sends downstream messaging to other folks and other agencies who are looking to them as leaders to guide them."

The uncertainty is already hitting North Carolina harm reduction programs. Lauren Kestner, director of Queen City Harm Reduction in Charlotte, said she got an email from the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services encouraging organizations to expedite their purchases of drug checking supplies just in case more restrictions materialize from other funders. Another recent email from a state health department employee included a form for organizations to order naloxone, and it noted in highlighted text: "At this time, test strips are not available for request."

A DHHS spokesperson told NC Health News that the department has temporarily paused the purchasing of fentanyl and xylazine test strips while awaiting clarification from SAMHSA about the recent "Dear Colleague" letter and any potential changes related to allowable costs under federal funding.

"It is important to note that other non-federally funded resources remain available and may be used for overdose prevention programs to access test strips, such as state and local opioid settlement funds," the department wrote in an email.

For Kestner, the pause shows how quickly federal policy changes filter down to organizations such as hers. She called the new SAMHSA guidance a fear-mongering tactic that she believes will continue spreading.

Immortal glam rock: Lestat takes center stage in Anne Rice series

Time is arguably one of the biggest constraints in human life. Given that the average human lifespan is estimated at 73.8 years worldwide in 2026 (per Worldometers.info), there's little denying that the amount one could conceivably conquer in a lifetime is finite. But if one could, say, live forever, imagine all the many skills that could be reasonably acquired; all that could be crossed off a never-ending bucket list.

The persistence of time — and supernatural abilities that allow a precious few to live beyond its boundaries — is at the center of Anne Rice's steamy literary universe, which includes "The Vampire Chronicles," "Lives of the Mayfair Witches" and "Servant of the Bones," to name a few. Thankfully for her fans (and those who just love a great TV show), "Interview with the Vampire" was picked up by AMC and developed into a series of the same name in 2020.

"Interview with the Vampire," the first series in Rice's Immortal Universe on AMC, released in late October 2022 and saw a second season a little more than 18 months later, in May 2024. The series returns this spring for a third season, this time under the title "The Vampire Lestat," a direct reference to the second book in Rice's Vampire Chronicles series.

"The Vampire Lestat" premieres Sunday, June 7, on AMC and AMC+.

Despite being the third season in the "Interview with the Vampire" series, "The Vampire Lestat," as is evidenced by its name change, is an entirely new story. While there exists an evolution of the series' characters and plot elements, viewers should not expect a direct continuation of "Interview with the Vampire" in the traditional sense. Instead, the series primarily follows Lestat, played by "The Astronaut Wives Club" actor Sam Reid, as he branches out to explore a vocation in the arts. Now an influential rock star, Lestat brings the ghosts of his past on tour with him.

"The Vampire Lestat goes on tour while being haunted by 'muses' from his past," reads the official AMC logline for the series' newest season. "As the band's popularity grows, so does Lestat's influence over vampires and humans alike, leaving others to contend with Les-

tat's power in the face of the Great Conversion."

And the hype for the Vampire Lestat, as a character and as a musical act, seems to be gaining traction in our world as well. AMC's Immortal Universe page on Instagram has been completely transformed into an edgy, 1990s-coded promo site, complete with concert posters, virtual magazine covers and documentary-style footage of the band and crew, presumably all filmed by Daniel Molloy, who is portrayed by returning cast member Eric Bogosian ("Uncut Gems," 2019).

Bogosian appeared in both seasons of "Interview with the Vampire," not as a creature of the night but as the initiator of the titular interview. A journalist by trade, Molloy's familiarity with various forms of media communication makes him the perfect person to capture every delicious moment of Lestat's enthralling presence, both on and off the stage. And given that he now has experience chronicling the undead lives of vampires in America, why not turn his attention from Lou-

is (Jacob Anderson, "Game of Thrones") to his sire and take the show on the road?

Louis de Pointe du Lac also returns for the series' third season. Still portrayed by Anderson, Louis is taking on the role of supporting character as Lestat gets his time to shine

(idiomatically speaking, of course — Rice's vampires don't glitter the way they do in the Twilight series).

Also supporting Lestat's story are Delainey Hayles ("Holby City") as Louis and Lestat's forever-young offspring Claudia; Assad Zaman ("Hotel Portofino") as the vampire

Armand, who may get his own series at some point, provided the series continues to follow the path of the novels; Joseph Potter ("My Policeman," 2022) as Nicolas de Lenfant, a French vampire and ill-fated lover of Lestat's; Jennifer Ehle ("Pride and Prejudice") as Lestat's mother, Gabriella, who was turned by Lestat himself; Ben Daniels ("The Exorcist") as Santiago, lead actor for Paris's Theatre des Vampires; and Roxane Duran ("Marie Antoinette") as dollmaker-turned-vampire Madeleine, sired expressly to serve as a companion for Claudia.

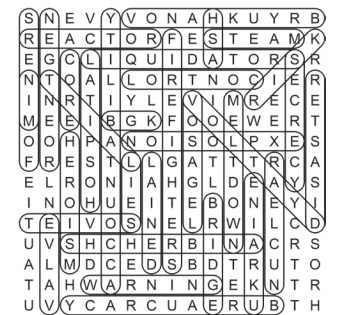
Promotional materials for the series are extravagant and rather unique. In addition to the usual trailers, posters and interviews, AMC shared the entire opening sequence to the show via Instagram on March 13. Featuring the glam-rock song "Long Face" by the Vampire Lestat (performed by Reid), one of several songs written for the series, the intro shows several gritty and distorted close-ups of Lestat's face, placing particular focus on his mesmerizing light blue eyes. Interrupted by interstitials of highway driving, guitar riffs, grimy tour bus interiors and

elaborate gothic dining tables dressed with bones and candelabras, it is immediately clear that Lestat's onstage persona leans very heavily into his identity as a real-life vampire.

In early April, AMC even announced a "Backstage Pass," which "invit[ed] partners to hit the road with rock star Lestat for a Season 3 promotional tour including a variety of stops" with Reid "headlining as the most immortal rock star the world has ever seen."

Needless to say, it looks like everyone is hungry for more Lestat.

Don't miss the premiere of "The Vampire Lestat," also known as "Interview with the Vampire" Season 3, when it arrives on AMC and AMC+ Sunday, June 7.

Extinction event television: Prehistory comes to life in 'Surviving Earth'

Every April 22, we celebrate our wonderful planet by recognizing Earth Day, but unlike calendar holidays such as Mother's Day, Father's Day and Labor Day, Earth's hard work is not all accomplished in one singular 24-hour period.

Regardless of one's personal and religious beliefs about the creation of our world, science has shown that since life has been on Earth, several tectonic shifts and extinction-level events have shaped and reshaped our planet's landscape, flora and fauna. The creatures that survive often evolve into a new iteration of their old selves, learning to adapt to changes in their environment and keep on trucking (so to speak).

This sentiment is at the very heart of NBC's newest docuseries, "Surviving Earth." Premiering

Thursday, June 11, on NBC and its affiliated streaming service Peacock, new episodes release weekly over a period of eight weeks and tell Earth's story as it has never before been seen.

"Surviving Earth" comes from Universal Television Alternative Studios and Loud Minds, the latter of which is overseen by creative director Tim Haines, who rose to acclaim following the six-part BBC documentary series "Walking with Dinosaurs" in 1999. Haines and Loud Minds are also behind the multi-city immersive attraction Dinosaurs in the Wild, which allowed exhibitiongoers to travel some 67 million years back in time to explore Earth in the Cretaceous Period.

Despite the attraction going above and beyond to show everything from "prehistoric animals in cages" to "an autopsy on a giant dinosaur" (per NatGeoKids.com), its

doors were shuttered in 2018, per its planned tour schedule, which ended in London, England.

Less than a decade later, Haines brings his dino-sized world back to the small screen for ongoing learners to experience the majesty and wonder of our world at work. Spanning eight hourlong episodes, "Surviving Earth" offers an inside look at the final days of some of the planet's more bizarre and beautiful prehistoric creatures.

Beginning with the Permian-Triassic Mass Extinction event, also known as PTME or the Great Dying, Haines and the creative team behind "Surviving Earth" illustrate the circumstances behind Earth's greatest known biotic crisis. According to the Pictures Impossible/Loud Minds Instagram page (@picturesimpossible), the premiere episode portrays the "struggles of a gorgon (Inostrancevia) pack to survive in an overheating

world" — something which sadly sounds all too familiar amid our current climate crisis.

"This episode also features Scutosaurus, Suminia and Elph," the description continues. "After the event, we jump 10 million years forward to discover a reptile rebirth featuring Cyamodus, Dongosuchus, Cymbospondylus and Protopterosaurus."

In the second episode of the series, airing the following week on NBC and streaming, we travel forward approximately 25 million years to the Carnian Pluvial Episode (or CPE), wherein "we experience the beginnings of climate instability which leads to the rise of dinosaurs."

"It stars a hatchling Ischigualastia growing up in a drought," reads the @picturesimpossible description for Episode 2. "She meets Panphagia, Saurosuchus and Rhynchosaurs. We then jump forward eight million years to when the climate is drier and more stable and dinosaurs dominate. These include Lessemsaurus, Zupaysaurus and the early mammal Chalmiria."

Each of the series' eight episodes is designed to be a stand-alone experience, meaning that the events portrayed are not necessarily presented in chronological order. As the series progresses, viewers will also witness "a mated pair of Nanuqsaurus," "a mother Pliosaur and a mother Spinosaurus struggle to raise their young as the oceans stagnate," a female Diplodocus who is trapped in a "struggle to survive as the climate dries" and a "stunning reef full of Crinoids and Carolinites," wherein "a male Sacabambaspis tries to build a nest to attract a mate."

Digital effects for "Surviving Earth" are provided by Loud Minds and Milk VFX, a British visual effects studio based in London. In addition to the company's feature film VFX history, which includes work on "47 Ronin" (2013), "The Martian" (2015), "Annihilation" (2018) and "Meg 2: The Trench" (2023), Milk VFX has a history of paleo-documentary excellence on television.

Beginning in 2013 with the BBC Studios and Discovery Channel co-

production "Ice Age Giants," Milk VFX has accomplished work on more than 30 TV projects over the past 13 years, including "Doctor Who," "Sherlock," "The Alienist," "Good Omens," "Dracula," "Citadel" and Sir David Attenborough's 3D television adventure titled "David Attenborough's Natural History Museum Alive," which, like "Ice Age Giants," aired in the company's founding year.

And should "Surviving Earth" have you craving more information about natural history and the creation of our modern world, never fear: NBC has you covered. Following the new series' premiere, NBC is rereleasing "The Americas," a recent geological documentary favorite narrated by two-time Oscar winner Tom Hanks ("Forrest Gump," 1994) and chronicling the division of land mass into what is now known as North America and South America.

Don't miss your chance to witness history as it evolves: "Surviving Earth" premieres Thursday, June 11, on NBC and Peacock.

The house always wins: Isaac to lead Netflix casino drama

The house always wins: After partnering with Netflix on the film "Triple Frontier" (2019), "Frankenstein" (2025) and, most recently, "Beef" Season 2, Oscar Isaac is extending his working relationship with the streamer, having signed on to star in and executive produce a new drama set in a Las Vegas casino.

From "Billions" co-creators Brian Koppelman and David Levien, "The Roman" is an eight-episode series that explores the high-stakes world of Sin City's casino business. Isaac will play casino president Robert "Bobby Red" Redman, "who has to make some long-odds moves to try and secure his position and take more ground," according to the official logline.

Joining Isaac are Betty Gilpin ("GLOW") as Bobby's "formidable wife and a brilliant, highly connected lawyer"; Alec Baldwin ("The Departed," 2006) as casino boss Paul "Primo" Clark, "the longtime chairman of the organization and a surrogate father figure to Bobby who isn't afraid to let his proteges fight for his favor"; and David Costabile ("Billions") as rival casino operator Bill Saverick, "a longtime associate of Bobby's who often finds himself caught between being a loyal friend and a target of the town's aggressive business maneuvers."

The series was originally announced in December, back when the then-untitled project didn't have an official title yet — but it did have a big name attached as executive producer: legendary film director Martin Scorsese, whose 1995 epic "Casino" similarly delved into Las Vegas history.

Scorsese is still on board as executive producer via Sikelia Produc-

tions, while Koppelman and Levien are juggling writing, producing and showrunning duties. Filmmaker J.C. Chandor, who previously directed Isaac in both "Triple Frontier" (2019) and "A Most Violent Year" (2014), will be working with him again as the director of the series' first two episodes.

It's worth noting that, along with his casting, Isaac also secured a first-look deal with Netflix, meaning the streamer now has first dibs on film and TV projects from Mad Gene — the New York-based production company run by Isaac, writer and director (and wife) Elvira Lind ("Songs for Alexis," 2014) and producer/executive Gena Konstantinacos ("King Hamlet," 2025). Netflix also recently acquired the Isaac-led movie "In the Hand of Dante" (2025), which premiered at the Venice International Film Festival last September and is slated for release on the streamer later this year.

Oscars threeppeat: It's official! Conan O'Brien ("Conan") will be back as Oscars host in 2027, making it three years in a row.

"Conan has created remarkable energy around the Oscars," said Craig Erwich, president of Disney Television Group. "His singular comedic voice makes Hollywood's biggest night one of the most entertaining celebrations of the year."

Behind the scenes, O'Brien's producers, Jeff Ross and Mike Sweeney (both of "Conan O'Brien Must Go"), will also return, as will live TV event producers Raj Kapoor ("Adele: One Night Only") and Katy Mullan ("Hannah Waddingham: Home for Christmas").

"Getting to reunite with Conan O'Brien for a third year at the Oscars is really special," Kapoor and Mullan said in a joint statement. "He brings

that signature humor everyone loves, along with a real warmth and generosity that carry through the entire show. He's a true creative partner, someone we trust completely, and someone who makes the whole process genuinely fun, both behind the scenes and on stage. We're incredibly grateful to keep building this together and can't wait to share what's next."

O'Brien's return isn't surprising, given he earned high marks for this year's telecast, which wrapped up a humorous skit that saw O'Brien given the title of "Host for Life."

If you're a numbers person, this sets up an interesting situation, with both the Golden Globes and Oscars featuring repeat hosts in 2027; Nikki Glaser ("Trainwreck," 2015) will re-

turn as Golden Globes emcee. It also puts O'Brien on par with Jerry Lewis ("The Nutty Professor," 1963), Steve Martin ("Only Murders in the Building"), Conrad Nagel ("Red Wine," 1928) and David Niven ("A Matter of Life and Death," 1946) in terms of number of Oscars hosted, but if he's aiming for Bob Hope's ("The Ghost Breakers," 1940) record, O'Brien will need to host 16 more times after that.

Scheduled for Sunday, March 14, 2027, the 99th Oscars will be the penultimate Academy Awards for both Disney/ABC and the ceremony's longtime home of the Dolby Theatre. The 101st edition of the awards ceremony will be held at the Peacock Theater and will air on YouTube.

Mission Midoriyama: 'American Ninja Warrior' returns with new, epic challenges

Mission Midoriyama: Hosts Matt Iseman ("Clean House"), Akbar Gbaja-Biamila ("The Talk") and Zuri Hall ("Access Hollywood") welcome a new season, new competitors and a new racecourse in the Season 18 premiere of "American Ninja Warrior," coming to NBC Sunday, June 8, and streaming the next day on Peacock.

"From mind-boggling obstacles to heartwarming Ninja stories, Season 18 is set to deliver the goods," promises NBC. While offering some

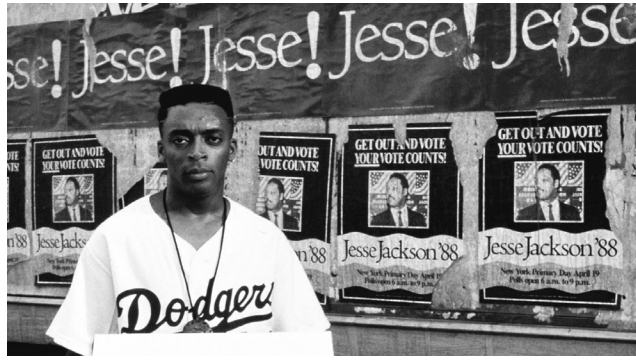

Denzel Washington directed an episode of "Grey's Anatomy"

Q: I was watching an old episode of "Grey's Anatomy" and saw Denzel Washington in the credits. I watched it three times but couldn't spot him. Did he have a bit role that I just couldn't see?

A: The reason you didn't see Hollywood legend Denzel Washington ("Training Day," 2001) in that episode of "Grey's Anatomy" was because he was never on camera. After all, he's not the kind of guy you miss.

Washington actually directed the Season 12 episode "The Sound of Silence." And it was a rare moment in his career.

Throughout his near-50 years in the film biz, Washington has only directed five projects — and this was his only foray into television so far. Reportedly, he only took the job because his wife was a huge fan of the show.

That's according to "Grey's" star Ellen Pompeo ("Moonlight Mile," 2002) in an episode of her podcast

"Tell Me With Ellen Pompeo."

But that's not to say he was slumming it. "Grey's" is one of the most successful and beloved shows in history, having been on ABC for an incredible 23 seasons and counting.

And he's not the only big-name actor to direct the show. Phylicia Rashad ("The Cosby Show"), Eric Stoltz ("Pulp Fiction," 1994) and David Paymer ("Mr. Saturday Night," 1992) have all helmed episodes over the years.

Q: Is Mike Colter going to come back as Luke Cage in the new "Daredevil" show?

A: Much as fans might want to see it, a full Luke Cage revival doesn't seem to be in the cards for Mike Colter ("The Good Wife") — partly because he just got very busy with a brand-new show.

For those not up to date with the sprawling Marvel cinematic and television universe, Colter played the title role in the Netflix series "Luke Cage" — a New York-based superhero with super strength and unbreakable skin. It was part of a series

of Netflix shows centered around the better-known superhero Daredevil (played by Charlie Cox, of 2014's "The Theory of Everything").
